THE IMPACT OF ONE

In Loving Memory of Wesley Thomas Schaub

After 22 years of marriage, Bill and Jen Schaub were enjoying life with their two teenagers, Harrison and Cecelia, assuming their baby days were long past. But in September of 2018, they got the surprise of their lives; Jen was pregnant!

A mixture of nerves and excitement, Bill and Jen began to share their news with friends and family and were met with overwhelming love and support. Everyone stepped in to help them prepare — throwing baby showers, sending gifts in the mail and making sure the Schaubs had everything they needed.

Throughout Jen's pregnancy, she had multiple checkups and ultrasounds that all showed a healthy baby boy. They named him Wesley Thomas. He was very active and displayed his fierce little personality, as Wesley didn't always cooperate with the ultrasound technician. He also showed off his sweet tooth and would turn it up a notch with flips and belly kicks whenever Jen ate ice cream.

At 37 weeks, three weeks before Jen's due date, Jen became dizzy and lightheaded in the middle of the night. They called an ambulance and rushed her to the hospital. Their doctor did an ultrasound right away and could not detect a heartbeat. They rushed Jen into the operating room for an emergency C-section.

On April 18, 2019, Wesley was delivered stillborn. After the delivery they had him baptized.

In the wake of unimaginable grief, the Schaubs reached out to us. In Wesley's obituary, they had asked friends and family to make donations to Pregnancy Care Center in Wesley's memory. They had also decided to donate all of Wesley's nursery items to be given as gifts, since they had been shown such generosity through gifts themselves.

I'll never forget the day Bill and Jen dropped off Wesley's things at PCC. We were at a loss for words as we worked together to unload the carefully selected crib, carseat, books and tiny clothes. We cried. It was a broken hallelujah. Mourning the loss of one precious child, as we prepared his things to welcome others into the world.

It has struck me time and time again since that day, how much of an impact one life can have. Wesley's life is evidence that our impact does not come from the things the world tells us. It doesn't come from our perfect health, independence, relationships, wealth, education, occupation or length of life. Wesley lived his entire earthly life in his Mother's womb, and yet... his impact on this world has been both profound and eternal.

God knew the number of Wesley's days long before he was created. The gifts given to the Schaubs to prepare for their own surprise, 'unplanned' baby, will now go to dozens of surprise, unplanned babies who've been saved from abortion. Wesley's life and legacy are changing the world, because his family is allowing God to use them.

Through the money donated in Wesley's honor, there has been enough to cover the cost of FOUR life-saving and life-changing appointments.

Wesley's crib and a number of smaller items will be going to a baby boy, the son of our patient *Hannah (you can read her story on the next page). After telling Hannah about the crib, she squealed with excitement and said, "Thank you so much! I am so excited! I wasn't excited in the beginning, but now I am. I just love him so much already!"

Wesley's stroller, carseat and baby bottles went to a single mom, who also found out she was pregnant through an ultrasound at PCC. When we told her about the gifts, she was ecstatic! She told us, "without you guys I probably wouldn't be keeping my baby; I wouldn't have known what to do."

While nothing can lessen the deep loss of Wesley's passing, God is bringing blessings, beauty and PURPOSE in the midst of that loss. This we firmly believe: what the enemy intends for evil, God WILL use for good, if we are willing to give our grief, doubt and burden over to Him.

Just after getting a positive pregnancy test at home, *Hannah's boyfriend quickly exited the picture, leaving her in a fearful panic. As she shared with us pieces of her story over the phone, she explained that she honestly felt that abortion might truly be her best option.

After learning about the benefits of an ultrasound and all that PCC could offer her, Hannah scheduled an appointment. As we do for all our patients, as a staff, we prayed that the Lord would bring her to us for her appointment and that He would prepare her heart for what He planned to do.

As the time approached, we were disappointed when Hannah did not show up for her appointment. This sometimes happens - when it does, it is always hard. But we know that God is working where we cannot see, and we pray that He is still able to use us - even if it's only through one phone call.

A short time later, Hannah called us back, apologizing for missing her appointment! She said that she still would like to come in and asked if she could reschedule - we got her in as soon as we could! When Hannah came, she openly shared with us her anxieties and detailed some of the difficulties she was going through. She sobbed as she explained that, deep down, she wanted to parent, but she was scared. She felt entirely alone. She really wanted the ultrasound to tell her how far along she was, knowing that this would affect her decision of whether or not to carry to term.

When the image of the ultrasound came up on the screen, she was completely shocked! The ultrasound showed us a beautifully developed baby, squirming, kicking and waving, with an enthusiastic heartbeat. After sharing with her the estimated due date, Hannah exclaimed that this date had a special significance to her - and that she felt like maybe God was telling her that He didn't want her to abort. After the ultrasound, there were more tears, more fears expressed, but there was also so much hope.

We were able to encourage her, equip her with knowledge and tools, and pray with her before she left. Since then, God has given us some follow-up opportunities to bless her and give her practical referrals and resources. We

were also able to offer her a beautiful dresser full of newborn items and a gorgeous crib from a little boy named Wesley Schaub (read his story on the page prior, *The Impact of One*). More important than anything, God allowed us to emphasize how much He loves and values her, and how He is trustworthy. He has a good plan for her future and for the future of this child.

Please join us in asking the Lord to open more doors of opportunity for us and other Believers to minister to Hannah - that she may be strong throughout this pregnancy and reaffirmed and supported in her decision to carry her baby to term.

A question we often receive is, "How is PCC different from Right To Life?" Let's start with the similarities. Both organizations are essential in promoting the sanctity of human life and work sacrificially to accomplish this mission. PCC admires and appreciates the work that our local Grand Traverse Right To Life office endeavors to accomplish.

The differences: Since PCC and RTL are separate organizations, they are governed and funded in different ways, often through different sources. The most significant difference is in how we go about carrying out our mission. RTL's focus is to educate people on identified RTL issues and legislation and to promote and support prolife candidates.

PCC's focus is to reach out to abortion-vulnerable women and men, providing support, education and professional medical services that will empower them to choose life for their unborn children and pro-abundant life for their families.





I am confident that I am not the only one who has been touched by the Schaubs' story (see page 4, The Impact of One), and like me you may be wondering if there's anything that **YOU** can do.

Wesley, like many children in our area, was unplanned. But, while he and his parents were celebrated and supported throughout the pregnancy and their every need was provided by an outstanding support-system, there are so many women and men in our area who don't have this expereince. Most unplanned pregnancies are seen as a threat and something to be 'taken care of' and very often, the parents do not have the love and support they need from their family or friends.

This is where **YOU** come in!
